Welcome!

First of all, **CONGRATULATIONS**. The fact that you are reading this reveals that there is a holy dissatisfaction within you, a cry for change, for revival, and a heart that burns with love—for Jesus, for His church, for your city, and for your nation. It also reveals something rare and powerful: a willingness to obey the Word of God and to act in a time of great urgency. You are one of those who refuse to stand idly while the church becomes more apostate and darkness advances—you are choosing to respond.

Ultimately, we do this because He has already told us to in His Word. We do this because Jesus is worthy of our obedience, even if we receive nothing in return. The good news is that your response will not be without results! God always honors His Word!

We have never seen anyone complete the 21 Days of Consecration without being transformed and experiencing an increase in God's presence. When the church unites and participates together, we have even seen churches and entire communities enter into true biblical revival.

FACING THE TRUTH

We must recognize and face the truth about our true condition. Much of the Body of Christ no longer experiences a consistent, tangible awareness of God's presence in their lives, homes, and churches.

The Bible is very clear that if we do not have His presence, there are things we are doing—or failing to do—that grieve His Spirit and hinder His manifest presence among us.

Much of the church has exchanged presence for programs, glory for gold, and spiritual fruit for numerical success. Too often, success is measured by size rather than by God's presence, power, and true fruit.

A church that honors the headship of Jesus is will have His tangible presence. Revival is simply a return to what should be normal Christianity. It is a restoring of the centrality and simplicity of the true Gospel: that everything is Christ and Him crucified!

A PATTERN

The Bible and history make one thing clear: the only One who can truly transform a person, a family, a church, a city, or a nation—and preserve it from destruction—is the same Person who ignites revival: **JESUS CHRIST**. And while many wait for God to bring revival and change, He is waiting for us. He is looking for a remnant to rise up, repent, pray and respond to His word—so that He may then release the fullness of His presence and transforming power.

If there is anything in this material with which you may not fully agree—doctrinally or otherwise—we lovingly ask that you not dismiss the entire message or withdraw from participation because of these differences. In this urgent time, unity under Christ's leadership is more vital than ever. We are open to dialogue and invite you to contact us if anything raises questions or concerns. We are committed to walking humbly and remaining teachable, always desiring to align our hearts with the truth of God's Word.





Goals and Initial Considerations

This is just the **beginning**—a first step in a series of materials that, if embraced, will not only bless you—but can radically transform your life and your family. But this will only happen if you begin to apply these principles. Don't wait. Start now—even before the *21 Days of Consecration* this year.

The purpose of the 21-Day Guide is to help us obey the Word, repent, be revived, return to our first love, and prepare the Brazilian church to become a dwelling place for the presence of God (Ephesians 2:22), so that His glory and life may be reflected—resulting in the salvation of the lost and the transformation of our communities. This necessarily involves spiritual disciplines such as prayer, worship, fasting, unity, reconciliation, repentance, forgiveness, pursuit of holiness, health, and healing (emotional, spiritual, and physical).

This is a time of consecration before the Lord and in unity with our brothers and sisters. It is both a personal and collective action. After spending time before the Lord, our appetite for His presence will have increased! If we recover our hunger for God and return to Him in humility and righteousness, He will draw near to us in a tangible way. Then, the presence and reality of Jesus will be among us, bringing life and making us effective in reaching the lost and bringing transformation to the community, the city, and the nation.

FOUNDATIONS

Before we discuss the practical and logistical aspects of this time of consecration, we need to understand WHY it is so important. We need a solid, biblical foundation for what we are about to do—and for what we believe God will do. This is only the first part of the introduction to the subject. If you sign up, you will receive the entire guide and several e-books that will transform your life.

Expectations

If you begin to put into practice what you learn here, you will:

- Begin to tear down the spiritual barriers that have kept you from experiencing the love and presence of God continually—and enter a deeper level in your walk with Him;
- See your prayers begin to break through the heavens and be answered—many even instantly;
- Lead your family into a genuine experience of revival and restoration.

This material was created to be **clear, comprehensive, and practical**. The Scriptures cited are not an exhaustive list, but rather a powerful sample—each one pointing to key biblical principles that God is highlighting in this hour.

We strongly recommend that you read each passage in full and in its context, allowing the Holy Spirit to speak to you *personally*.

Above all, this material should serve as a **mirror**. As you read, bring everything before the Lord in secret. Let Him search your heart. Invite Him, as David did, to expose anything in you that grieves Him (Psalm 139:23–24).

And a warning: if the thought arises—“So-and-so really needs to read this”—stop. Let the Holy Spirit deal with you first and with the plank in your own eye.

If you recognize any of the sins or areas of compromise mentioned here in your own life, do not delay. This is your moment to repent.

The Consequences of Our Sin

The Consequences of Our Sin on Our Spiritual Life

Psalm 24:4 declares that only those with clean hands and a pure heart may ascend the mountain of the Lord. In the New Covenant, “ascending the mountain” means much more than religious duty—it means experiencing in the soul the eternal life that already dwells in your spirit. It means encountering God’s love, presence, thoughts, and emotions for you. It means accessing everything Jesus purchased on the cross—but first it is necessary to be born again (John 3:3)!

(If you are not sure that you have been born again and that you will go to heaven, contact us. We want to show you how to be born again.)

In the Kingdom of God, nothing can be bought — everything was paid for by Jesus. As children of God, we have access to everything that belongs to Christ, for we are co-heirs with Him in all things (Romans 8:17; Ephesians 1:3). But here is the mystery: although God fully dwells in our spirit, it is in the soul that we experience Him. And for this to happen, we must choose to “open the door” between spirit and soul — which means repenting, thus allowing Christ to have fellowship with us (Revelation 3:20 — “Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me.”).

In Psalm 24:4, “clean hands” refers to external sins — actions, words, and visible behavior. “Pure heart” deals with internal sins — thoughts, motivations, emotions, judgments, and unforgiveness.

One of the greatest sins the church is failing to recognize and repent of is its love for the world and friendship with it. We can identify what we truly love by examining how we spend our extra time, extra money, what we primarily talk about, and what we continually set our minds upon. If we spend more of our time, money, words, and thoughts on the world than on God, His Kingdom, and His purposes, then we must face the truth: we love the world.

1 John 2:15–17 says:

“Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world. The world is passing away, and also its lusts; but the one who does the will of God lives forever.”

This truth is striking: the worst consequence of sin and love for the world is this—we lose the ability to experience the love of the Father. And to experience that love is exactly the reason why we were created and the key to everything (John 17:3, 23–24).

The Consequences of Our Sins On the Land

Isaiah 24:5 (ESV) reveals a sobering reality:

"The earth lies defiled under its inhabitants; for they have transgressed the laws, violated the statutes, broken the everlasting covenant."

2 Chronicles 7:13–15 brings the words of God Himself:

"If I shut up the heavens so that there is no rain, or if I command the locust to devour the land, or if I send pestilence among My people, and My people who are called by My name humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sin and will heal their land. Now My eyes will be open and My ears attentive to the prayer offered in this place."

Why does God hear and heal the land only after His people humble themselves, pray, seek Him and turn from sin? Because it was the pride and sin of His own people that defiled the land and was keeping Him from hearing our prayers. These and many other passages show that what we tolerate or allow in our hearts and lives does not affect only us—it affects the spiritual climate around us. Our sin has shut heaven's ears to our prayers. Our sin is impacting the land, the people, the atmosphere, and the spiritual reality where we live.



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James 3:16 gives us a clear example of the effect of sin:

"For where envy and selfish ambition exist, there will be confusion and every evil thing."

Other translations and references bring this truth to light with piercing clarity:

Envy and ambition → every evil practice

Jealousy → all kinds of evils

Self-interest → every bad thing

Strife → confusion

- *Disorder and rebellion → morally degrading acts*

Selfishness → all kinds of evil

Factions and discord → chaos, ruthlessness

In God's eyes, even hidden sins—such as unforgiveness, jealousy, pride, and gossip—open the door to spiritual forces of darkness. What we tolerate in our hearts becomes a breeding ground for evil to operate in our lives, churches, and cities. Therefore, it is often possible to measure the spiritual health of the Church by looking at the statistics of violence, immorality, and destruction in our communities. So, the sad reality is this: many of the problems in our cities and nation are the result of the Church's own sin.

But... there is WONDERFUL news!

If we want to see lasting change—personal transformation, revival in our families, awakening in our churches, and healing and transformation in our cities—then we need to face the truth of our true condition, tear our hearts, and repent deeply.

God has given authority to His Church on earth (Matthew 28:19), and we have been called to reign as a royal priesthood (Revelation 5:10).

If we respond—if we truly humble ourselves, REPENT, and obey 2 Chronicles 7:14 and Joel 2:12–17—then God, who cannot lie:

He will forgive. He will hear. He will restore. He will heal our land.

And it will change the destiny of our families, churches and nation!
